This year, Amazon opened its **\$75 million**, 1,015,740 square-foot e-commerce fulfillment center ultimately employing more than 800 people. Additionally, Medline will open their 1.3 million square-foot, **\$120 million** facility creating another 300 jobs. Both of these monumental projects are located in the Town of Montgomery.

A critical component to successful economic development is a strong private sector. Equally important is a stable economy. My administration has worked diligently to stabilize County finances, settle union contracts, and continue the steady and effective growth of our economy. Our progress is promising, and our proactive efforts to grow the economy and show that Orange County wants businesses to come here and stay here will continue. Celebrating Vision Lou Heimbach

In 1984, then County Executive, Lou Heimbach appreciated the potential of Orange County and realized that it lacked a cohesive economic development plan to match that potential. Despite the fact that thirty-two different county organizations had the words "economic development" in their mission statement or charter, none were taking the lead. In fact, economic development was fragmented as municipalities, chambers and other agencies were competing for the new business looking to locate in the county.

Heimbach had a vision for a comprehensive economic **development** plan that would be void of politics and government. He invited a group of prominent business leaders to meet with him and tasked them with the development of the framework for a new private economic development agency. Three in the group, Donna Cornell, David DeWilde and William Vacca took the lead. The goal: Design a new, independent organization that would market the entire county with the goal to attract jobs.

Heimbach also realized that "buy-in" from the business community was a must if this new organization was to succeed. If the team Lou assembled was able to persuade the business community to invest in this new venture, he would then request the Orange County Legislature and the Orange County IDA to consider entering into contracts for services with the Private-not-for-Profit organization to the extent it would be in the best interest of each to do so.

The strategy worked! With a framework in place and operating dollars secured, the Orange County Economic Development Corporation (dba Orange County Partnership) was incorporated July 15, 1985 and the business community has been investing in the Partnership's mission and efforts for more than 35 years.

Today, the Partnership celebrates 35 years of economic development success and continues to be privately-funded and recognized as one of the most effective Economic Development centers in New York State. Countless Orange County residents are employed by companies that the Orange County Partnership worked to attract. It began with the vision of solid leaders and remains strong due to the dedication of the many outstanding boards, investors and people with vision.

HOW DAS PROMOTE BUSINESS

New York created Industrial Development Agencies (IDAs) in 1969 to serve as engines of economic growth for our communities and to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the state of New York.

The decision to extend benefits - tax relief and other incentives - rests solely within the discretion of the IDA Board of Directors. The IDA Board will consider the business opportunities generated by the project, the proposed number of both temporary and permanent jobs to be created, the anticipated wages, the scope of the company's capital investment in the project and the opportunities for the local workforce.

When an IDA issues a Payment In Lieu Of Taxes (PILOT), the company only receives tax incentives on the enhancements to the overall site, not to the property itself. The land itself continues to pay current taxes at the current rate. The schools and municipality never lose taxes.

IDA incentives are based upon what a community is receiving from the company. Incentives are only granted if the benefits to the community outweigh the incentives offered.

PILOT programs provide a predictable tax schedule that municipalities and school districts

utilize for budgeting purposes. It also provides predictability for corporate investors and financiers who are backing the project.

Local labor is guaranteed work on incentivized projects that go through IDAs that have adopted a local labor policy.

When land remains vacant, the municipality and school district collects only minimal taxes and no jobs are created.

AN EXAMPLE:

The taxes on a plot of vacant land are \$20,000 per year and it is creating no jobs.

The new incentivized company develops the property and creates 200 new jobs.

The new company continues to pay the \$20,000 annual land tax and pays a graduated increase in property taxes over the next 10 years on the enhancements to the site through a PILOT.

Job creation trickles down into the community creating a multiplier effect as employees shop local, dine local and contribute to the local economy.

The Road Ahead

The Orange County Partnership has been a leader in the effort to improve mobility as part of the 17-Forward-86 Coalition, which we co-founded with the goal of expanding capacity on the Route 17 corridor.

The Coalition comprises more than 200 members in economic development, civic organizations, construction trades, tourism and energy companies representing thousands of individuals who share a common vision to ensure the economic well-being of the Hudson Valley.

Our effort to add a third lane across Route 17 is nearing success. The New York State Department of Transportation held several workshops and has issued a Planning and Environment Linkages (PEL) study for the Route 17 corridor to address current and future transportation needs.

The PEL built upon previous NYSDOT studies that identified an additional lane as necessary to address safety and mobility on Route 17. The PEL will help accelerate the delivery of specific projects to add a third lane and upgrade various interchanges. Our current focus is to encourage NYSDOT to allocate funding to begin these environmental processes and include funding for

U.S. Representative Sean Patrick Maloney, NY-18, mentioned Route 17 in a press conference November 8, 2021 highlighting investments coming to the region following the House's passage of the **\$1 trillion infrastructure** package. Maloney pointed to \$13.5 billion that will go directly to New York State's highways and bridges, and said that revamping Route 17 through Orange County is "a much-needed project that has been stalled for too long."
